A hearing of ACCA's Disciplinary Committee will take place at 10.00 am Tuesday 15 July 2008, at The Lincoln Centre, 18 Lincoln's Inn Fields, London WC2A 3ED. The hearing is open to any member of the public or the media who wish to attend.

Three cases will be heard on this day:

- CASE 1 Concerns two students who are alleged to be guilty of misconduct in that they attempted to obtain an unfair advantage in a project by plagiarising previous model answer papers, contrary to the Fundamental Principle of Integrity, and obtained or attempted to obtain an unfair advantage in a project to be submitted to ACCA by colluding in their answers contrary to the Fundamental Principle of Integrity.
- CASE 2 Concerns a student who is alleged to be guilty of misconduct in that she took to her desk and/or possessed while at that desk, materials not authorised by the Registrar and intended to use them contrary to the Fundamental Principle of Integrity.
- CASE 3 Concerns a member who is alleged to be guilty of misconduct in that he failed to comply with an order made by the Admissions and Licensing Committee, requiring him to have audit work reviewed by an ACCA approved training company prior to the filing of auditing accounts with a Regulatory body, contrary to the Fundamental Principle of Integrity.
