## Member reprimanded

On 21 August 2019 the Consent Orders Committee of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) found proved the following allegation against a member/student Miss Kathry Rosemarie Lahiff from Co. Cork, Ireland:

## Allegation 1

- (a) That Miss Kathryn Rosemarie Lahiff failed to perform sufficient and appropriate audit work regarding Company A for year ended 30 June 2016.
- (b) That Miss Kathryn Rosemarie Lahiff's conduct as set out on paragraph 1(a) above was contrary to Paragraph 130.1(b) of ACCA's Code of Ethics and Conduct (as applicable 2018).
- (c) By reason of her conduct Miss Kathryn Rosemarie Lahiff is guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i) in respect of the matters set out at 1(a) and (b).

The Consent Orders Committee ordered that Miss Kathryn Rosemarie Lahiff be reprimanded, and pay costs to ACCA in the sum £1,770.50.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's finding and orders by way of a press release, as soon as practicable.
