Disciplinary Committee ordered Removal from Affilate Register

On 11 December 2019, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Neil McTaggart, of Braintree, Essex, United Kingdom:

Allegations

- (a) On 20 May 2019, ACCA Affiliate – Mr Neil McTaggart, was convicted at Chelmsford Crown Court of: [PRIVATE], which is discreditable to the Association or the accountancy profession;
- (b) By reason of his conduct at Allegation 1(a) above, Mr McTaggart is liable to disciplinary action pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(ix).

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Neil McTaggart be removed from the affilate register and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £1,000.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.

* An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate effect
