Disciplinary Committee ordered a Severe Reprimand*

On 20 February 2019, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Ms Seema Khan, of Croydon, Surrey, United Kingdom:

- (a) On 7 July 2016 Ms Seema Khan was convicted of two charges of executing or causing to be executed works of alteration to a Grade II listed building without listed building consent, contrary to sections 7, 9(2) and (4) of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 at Hammersmith Magistrates Court, which is discreditable to the Association or the accountancy profession.
- (b) By reason of her conduct at 1(a) above, Miss Seema Khan is liable to disciplinary action pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(ix).

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Ms Seema Khan receive a severe reprimand and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £7,000.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.
