Disciplinary Committee ordered Removal from Student register*

On 11 August 2020, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Mr Shawn Wafula, of Nairobi, Kenya:

Allegation 1

- a. On 06 October 2018 at Strathmore University CBE Centre, Nairobi, Kenya, during an MA1 (Management Information) examination, Mr Shawn Wafula sought to impersonate the exam entrant Miss Cindy Diana by sitting that examination on her behalf.
- b. Mr Shawn Wafula's conduct in respect of 1(a) was:
 - i. Dishonest, in that he sought to impersonate Miss Cindy Kimberly Diana in order to sit an examination on her behalf and thereby give her an unfair advantage in that exam; or in the alternative
 - ii. Contrary to the Fundamental Principle of Integrity, as applicable in 2018, in that such conduct demonstrates a failure to be straightforward and honest.
- c. By reason of his conduct, Mr Shawn Wafula is guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i) in respect of any of the matters set out at 1(a) to 1(b) above.

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Mr Wafula be removed from the student register and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £5,000.00.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.



ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.

* An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate effect
