Disciplinary Committee ordered removal from the student register*

On 12 February 2020, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against a student, Miss Ruohong Gan, Shanghai, China.

Allegation 1

- (a) During a Financial Reporting examination on 6 December 2018, Miss Ruohong Gan was in possession of unauthorised materials while the exam was in progress, contrary to Examination Regulation 5.
- (b) Miss Ruohong Gan intended to use the unauthorised materials above to gain an unfair advantage;
- (c) Miss Ruohong Gan's conduct in respect of 1(a) 1(b) above was:
 - (i) Dishonest, in that she intended to use the unauthorised materials which she had in her possession while the exam was in progress to gain an unfair advantage;
- (d) By reason of her conduct, Miss Ruohong Gan is:
 - (i) Guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i), in respect of any or all of the matters set out at 1(a) to 1(c) above;

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Miss Ruohong Gan be removed from the student register and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £2.000.
