Disciplinary Committee ordered Removal from the student register*

On 12 October 2020, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Miss Jingying Zheng, of Shenyang, Liaoning, People's Republic of China:

Allegation 1

- (a) During a Financial Reporting examination on 05 September 2019, Miss Jingying Zheng was in possession of:
 - (i) Unauthorised materials in the form of handwritten notes whilst at her exam desk, contrary to Examination Regulations 4 and/or 5.
- (b) Miss Jingying Zheng intended to use any or all of the items set out at 1(a) above to gain an unfair advantage.
- (c) Miss Jingying Zheng's conduct in respect of 1(b) above was:
 - (i) Dishonest, in that Miss Jingying Zheng intended to use any or all of the unauthorised materials which she had at her exam desk to gain an unfair advantage.
- (d) By reason of her conduct, Miss Jingying Zheng is:
 - (i) Guilty of misconduct pursuant to byelaw 8(a)(i), in respect of any or all of the matters set out at 1(a) to 1(c) above.

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Miss Jingying Zheng be removed from the student register and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £1,000.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.

** An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate effect*
