## Disciplinary Committee ordered Removal from Student Register\*

On 21 October 2020, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Mr Shayne Barran, Trincity, Trinidad and Tobago

## **Allegations**

- (a) On O3 June 2019, Mr Shayne Barran, in order to be excused from sitting an ACCA exam, submitted to ACCA a false medical certificate purporting to be issued by the University Hospital of New Jersey, when it had not been issued by that or any hospital.
- (b) Shayne Barran's conduct set out at 1(a) above was:
  - (i) Dishonest in that Mr Barran knew the medical certificate submitted by him was false and accordingly there was no sufficient basis for him being excused from an ACCA exam; in the alternative
  - (ii) Contrary to Subsection 111 Integrity of ACCA's Code of Ethics (2019) by reason of the conduct above
- (c) By reason of his conduct in respect of any or all of the matters set out at 1(a) and/or 1(b) above, Mr Shayne Barran is guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i).

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Mr Shayne Barran be removed from the student register and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £6,000.00.
