Member severely reprimanded

On 19 March 2020, the Consent Order Chair of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) found proved the following allegations against a member Mr John Joseph Greaney from Brighton, East Sussex, UK.

Allegation 1

Contrary to paragraph 14(2) of the Global Practising Regulations (as applicable in 2018-2019), between 26 April 2018 and on or about 5 February 2019, Mr John Joseph Greaney failed to supply ACCA with all the information necessary to enable ACCA to complete its monitoring process efficiently in that he:

- (a) Failed to provide an action plan of future improvements in Greaney Consulting Limited audit work in response to the findings of a monitoring visit
- (b) Failed to provide a copy his renewed professional indemnity policy showing cover of at least £125,000 or evidence of a waiver granted by the Admissions and Licensing Committee under the exception set out in Global Practising Regulations 9(6)(b)
- (c) By reason of his conduct in respect of the matters set out at 1(a) and 1(b), Mr John Joseph Greaney is guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i).

The Consent Orders Chair ordered that Mr Greaney be severely reprimanded, and pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £1,400.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Chair's finding and orders by way of a press release, as soon as practicable.
