## Disciplinary Committee ordered removal from student register\*

On 13 December 2021, the Disciplinary Committee of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) found proved the following allegations against a student Miss Yicheng Li from Shanghai, China.

## Allegation 1

- During a Taxation (UK) examination on 07 July 2020, Miss Yicheng Li was in possession of: a)
  - (i) Unauthorised materials in the form of two double sided handwritten notes, contrary to Examination Regulation4.
- b) Miss Yicheng Li intended to use the notes referred to at 1(a) above or either of them to gain an unfair advantage.
- Miss Yicheng Li's conduct in respect of 1(b) above was: c)
  - (i) Dishonest, in that Miss Yicheng Li intended to use either or both notes to gain an unfair advantage
- d) By reason of her conduct, Miss Yicheng Li is:
  - Guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i), in respect of any or all of the matters set (i) out at 1(a) to 1(c) above.

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Miss Yicheng Li be removed from the student register and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £4,612.50.

\* An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate effect.
