Disciplinary Committee ordered Student removed from the register*

On 12 October 2021, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Miss Hui Ding, of Heze, Shandong, China:

Allegations

Allegation 1

- (a) During an Advanced Financial Management (AFM) examination held on 10 July 2020, Miss Hui Ding was in possession of:
 - (i) Unauthorised materials in the form of 26 pages of typed/handwritten notes, contrary to Examination Regulation 4.
- (b) Miss Hui Ding intended to use those notes or any of them as set out at 1(a) above to gain an unfair advantage.
- (c) Miss Hui Ding's conduct in respect of 1(b) above was:
 - (i) Dishonest, in that Miss Hui Ding intended to use the notes or any of them to gain an unfair advantage.
- (d) By reason of her conduct, Miss Hui Ding is:
 - (i) Guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i), in respect of any or all of the matters set out at 1(a) to 1(c) above.

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Miss Hui Ding be Removed from the student register and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £3,500.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.

* An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate effect
