Disciplinary Committee ordered removal from student register*

On 20 December 2022, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Mr Al Shabaz of India:

Allegations

Mr Al Shabaz, a student member of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants ('ACCA'):

- Contrary to Regulation 3(1) of the Complaints and Disciplinary Regulations 2014 (as amended), failed to co-operate with the investigation of a complaint, in that he did not provide a sufficient response and/or respond fully to any or all of ACCA's correspondence dated:
 - a. 16 March 2021;
 - b. 7 April 2021;
 - c. 21 April 2021.
- 2) By reason of his conduct in respect of any or all of the matters set out at Allegation 1, Mr Shabaz is:
 - a. Guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i).

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Mr Al Shabaz be removed and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of ± 5000 .

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.

* An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate effect
