Disciplinary Committee ordered that the Member be excluded*

On 20 January 2023, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Mr Laurence Graham of Guernsey, United Kingdom:

Allegations

- 1. Mr Laurence Graham ('Mr Graham'), an ACCA Member:
 - On 12 October 2021 was convicted of one offence of Theft contrary to Section 9(1)(b) (Bailiwick of (a) Guernsey) Law, 1983 as amended AND on the same date Mr Graham was also convicted of an offence of Theft contrary to Section 1 of The Theft (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 1983, as amended at the Magistrate's Court of Guernsey, (being an offence(s) discreditable to ACCA and or the accountancy profession).
 - By reason of the conduct referred to at paragraph 1(a) above, Mr Graham is liable to disciplinary action (b) pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(ix).

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Mr Graham be removed from ACCA's register and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £5000.00.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.
