Member admonished*

On 19 September 2023, the Consent Orders Chair of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) found proved the following allegations against a member, Mr John Adeire Ademilusi, of Birmingham, United Kingdom:

Allegations

Allegation 1

Mr John Adeire Ademilusi, an Affiliate of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA):

- Breached the Membership Regulations 2014 (as applicable in 2020) with regards to the following: 1)
 - Between 17 August 2020 to 11 April 2023, was holding himself out to be in public practice (a) without a practicing certificate, contrary to paragraphs 6 2(b) and 8 2 (a) (ii) of the Membership Regulations 2014.

Allegation 2

2) Between 17 August 2020 to 31 May 2023, Mr Ademilusi failed to comply with the Money Laundering, Terrorist Financing and Transfer of Funds (information on the payer) Regulations 2017, in that he was not supervised in Anti-Money Laundering ("AML").

- 3) By reason of his conduct, Mr Ademilusi is:
 - I. Guilty of misconduct pursuant to byelaw 8(a)(i) in respect of any or all of the matters set out at Allegations 1 and 2; or in the alternative.
 - II. Liable to disciplinary action pursuant to byelaw 8(a)(iii).

The Consent Orders Chair ordered that Mr Ademilusi be admonished and pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £1299.00.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's finding and orders by way of a press release, as soon as practicable.
