# Disciplinary Committee ordered Member severely reprimanded\*

On 15 April 2024, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Mr Alan Chung Wah Tang of Causeway Bay, HongKong:

### **Allegations**

Mr Alan Chung Wah Tang, a member of ACCA

- 1. Pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(vi), is liable to disciplinary action by virtue of the disciplinary action taken against him and concluded on 30 December 2019 by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants being a professional and/or regulatory body.
- 2. Contrary to bye-law 10(b), failed to bring promptly to the attention of ACCA that he may have become liable to disciplinary action by reason of the action taken by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants as referred to in Allegation 1 above.
- 3. By reason of his conduct as referred to in Allegation 2 above, is liable to disciplinary action pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i) or, in the alternative bye-law 8(a)(iii).

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Mr Chung Wah be severely reprimanded and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £7,000.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.
