Member reprimanded *

On 27 March 2024, the Consent Orders Chair of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) found proved the following allegations against a member, Mrs Robyn Newling, of Barry, Wales, United Kingdom:

Allegations

Allegation 1

Pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(vi), Mrs Robyn Newling, an ACCA member, is liable to disciplinary action by virtue of action taken against her on 17 November 2022 by Propertymark.

The Consent Orders Chair ordered that Mrs Newling be reprimanded and pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £1440.00.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's finding and orders by way of a press release, as soon as practicable.
