Disciplinary Committee ordered student removed*

On 01 October 2024, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Miss Chenlin Jin of Shanghai, China:

Allegations

1. Miss. Chenlin Jin (“Miss. Jin”) a registered student of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (“ACCA”):
 - a. On 23 February 2021, submitted or caused to be submitted to ACCA, a false document purportedly from [Private] College, Shanghai University of Finance & Economics (“the Document”) in support of her request to withdraw from the 03 March 2021 ACCA Performance Management (PM) exam.
2. The conduct described at Allegation 1a) above, was:
 - a. Dishonest, in that she knew the document she submitted or caused to be submitted to ACCA was not genuine.
3. Contrary to Regulation 3(1) of the Complaints and Disciplinary Regulations 2014 (as applicable in 2021), Miss. Jin, failed to co-operate with the investigation of a complaint in that she failed to respond to ACCA’s correspondence dated:
 - a. 19 October 2021
 - b. 25 November 2021
 - c. 03 December 2021
4. By reason of the conduct described in any or all of the matters set out at Allegations 1) to 3), Miss. Jin is:

- a. Guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i).

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Miss Chenlin Jin be removed from the Student register and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £5,296.50.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.

** An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate effect*
