Disciplinary Committee ordered student to be removed*

On 02 April 2025, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Mr Khalid Ahmed of Abbottabad, Pakistan:

Allegations

Mr Khalid Ahmed ('Mr Ahmed'), a student member of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants ('ACCA'):

1. On 19 April 2021, failed to comply with instructions issued by ACCA personnel (as per the Student Information Sheet) before a FBT Business and Technology exam, in that he failed to ensure no one else was around him in the room where he sat his exam, contrary to Examination Regulation 2.
2. Contrary to Paragraph 3(1) of the Complaints and Disciplinary Regulations 2014 (as applicable in 2021), failed to co-operate fully with the investigation of a complaint, in that he did not respond to any or all of ACCA's correspondence dated:
 - a. 28 June 2021
 - b. 20 July 2021
 - c. 16 August 2021
3. By reason of his conduct, Mr Ahmed is:
 - a. Guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i), in respect of any or all of the matters set out at allegations 1 to 2 above.

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Mr Ahmed be removed from student register and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £5,144.00

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.

** An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate effect*
