Notice of hearing

A hearing of ACCA's Disciplinary Committee will take place at 12.00pm on 16 December 2025. It will be held remotely but based at the ACCA's Offices, The Adelphi, 1-11 John Adam Street, London, WC2N 6AU.

The hearing is open to any member of the public or the media who wish to attend. However, ACCA is only able to accommodate remote access to the hearing. Please contact adminadjudication@accaglobal.com to obtain information about attending this (or any other) hearing.

The case to be heard on this day concerns Mr Adnan Anjum.

<u>Allegations</u>

Mr Adnan Anjum, a student of the Association of Chartered Accountants (ACCA), in relation to an ondemand computer based remotely invigilated Corporate and Business Law (LW) exam ("the exam") on 25 March 2025:

- 1. Sat the exam whilst "LearnWave Remote", a third-party software program was running, which enabled remote access to the computer he used to sit the exam.
- Further to allegation 1, failed to close all third-party programs prior to the exam starting, contrary to 2. ACCA's instructions in the Student Information Sheet for Remote On Demand CBEs and/or the On-Demand CBE announcements.
- Further to allegations 1 and 2, caused or permitted remote access to the computer he used to sit the 3. exam so that a third-party proxy exam taker could sit the examination on his behalf.
- By reason of any or all of the matters referred to above in respect of allegations 1 to 3, Mr Anjum 4. failed to comply with one or more of:
 - Exam Regulation 2 in respect of allegations 1 and 2; a)

b)	Exam Regulation	10 in respect of allegations	1 and/or 2 and 3.

- 5. Mr Adnan Anjum's conduct in respect of any or all of allegations 1 to 4 above was:
 - a) Dishonest, in that he intended that a third-party exam proxy taker would sit the exam on his behalf, thereby gaining an unfair advantage in the exam; or in the alternative:
 - b) Such conduct demonstrates a lack of integrity.
- 6. By reason of the above, Mr Anjum is:
 - a) Guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i) in respect of any or all of the conduct above; or in the alternative:
 - b) Liable to disciplinary action pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(iii) in respect of any or all of the conduct in allegations 1 to 4.

The allegations listed above are current at the date of publication.

The case will be heard by a panel of the ACCA's Disciplinary Committee.
