Notice of hearing

A hearing of ACCA's Disciplinary Committee will take place at 09:30am on 16 July 2025. It will be held remotely but based at the ACCA's Offices, The Adelphi, 1-11 John Adam Street, London, WC2N 6AU.

The hearing is open to any member of the public or the media who wish to attend. However, ACCA is only able to accommodate remote access to the hearing. Please contact <u>adminadjudication@accaglobal.com</u> to obtain information about attending this (or any other) hearing.

The case to be heard on this day concerns Mr Moalim Ayub Abdullahi .

Allegations

Mr Moalim Ayub Abdullahi, an ACCA student:

- 1. On or around 6 December 2023, submitted or caused to be submitted to ACCA documentation purporting to be an ACCA transcript dated 31 December 2009 which was false.
- 2. In respect of allegation 1 above, by submitting, or causing to be submitted, the documentation he sought to represent that:
 - (a) He had passed examinations when he had not; and/or
 - (b) He was eligible for exemptions that he was not.
- 3. In respect of allegations 1 and/or 2 above Mr Abdullahi's conduct was:
 - (a) Dishonest; and/or
 - (b) Failed to demonstrate integrity; and/or

- (c) Reckless in that Mr Abdullahi failed to have any or sufficient regard for the need to ensure that representations made, and documentation submitted to ACCA as set out in allegations 1 and/or 2 were in fact accurate and true.
- 4. By reason of his conduct Mr Abdullahi is:
 - (a) Guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i) in respect of any or all of the matters above.

The allegations listed above are current at the date of publication.

The case will be heard by a panel of the ACCA's Disciplinary Committee.
