Member reprimanded*

On 17 July 2025, the Consent Orders Chair of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) found proved the following allegations against a member, Mrs Irina Stucere, of London, United Kingdom:

Allegations

The Association of Chartered Certified Accountants ("ACCA") and Mrs Irina Stucere ("the Parties"), agree as follows:

- 1. Mrs Irina Stucere, an ACCA member, admits the following:
 - Between 29 December 2020 and 20 May 2025, she was a director of a firm holding out to be a) in public practice, contrary to Membership Regulation 8(2)(a)(iii) (while an ACCA student and affiliate) and Global Practising Regulation 3(2)(a) (as while an ACCA member).
 - b) Between 29 December 2020 and 20 May 2025, held rights in a firm holding out to be in public practice which in effect put her in a position of principal of the firm, contrary to Membership Regulation 8(2)(a)(iv) (while an ACCA student and affiliate) and Global Practising Regulation 3(2)(b) (while an ACCA member).
 - Between December 2020 and October 2024, provided accountancy services within the terms c) of the Money Laundering, Terrorist Financing and Transfer of Funds (Information on the Payer) Regulations 2017 and failed to obtain ant-money laundering supervision with HMRC or another body recognised for such purposes, as required by Membership Regulation 8(2)(j) (while an ACCA student and affiliate) and Global Practising Regulation 3(2) of Annex 1 (while an ACCA member).
 - d) By reason of the conduct above, Mrs Stucere is guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i).

2. That Mrs Irina Stucere shall be reprimanded and pay costs to ACCA for the sum of £2,219.50.

The Consent Orders Chair ordered that Mrs Irina Stucere be reprimanded and pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £2219.50.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's finding and orders by way of a press release, as soon as practicable.
