Member severely reprimanded*

On 22 July 2025, the Consent Orders Chair of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) found proved the following allegations against a member, Mrs Kathleen Bernadette Cantillon, of Mallow, Cork, Ireland:

Allegations

Mrs Kathleen Bernadette Cantillon, an ACCA Fellow:

- 1. Between 14 November 2018 and January 2025, failed on behalf of Firm A to comply with or demonstrate compliance with the Criminal Justice (Money Laundering and Terrorist Financing) Act 2010 (as amended), namely:
 - Section 30A (Risk assessment by designated persons) (a)
 - (b) Section 54 (Internal policies, controls and procedures).
- 2. By reason of her conduct set out at allegation 1 above, Mrs Cantillon failed to comply with the Fundamental Principle of Professional Behaviour and Section B2 (Anti-money Laundering) of ACCA's Code of Ethics and Conduct (as applicable from 2017 to 2025).
- By reason of her conduct, Mrs Cantillon is guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i). 3.

The Consent Orders Chair ordered that Mrs Kathleen Bernadette Cantillon be severely reprimanded and pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £1,225.00.00 and a fine of £5,000.00.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's finding and orders by way of a press release, as soon as practicable.
