Disciplinary Committee ordered member excluded with immediate effect*

On 05 June 2025, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Miss Cheong Yin Mun of Sheung Wan, Hong Kong SAR of China:

Allegations

Miss Cheong Yin Mun, an ACCA Member:

- 1. Pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(vii), is liable to disciplinary action by virtue of the fact that on or about 17 July 2023, she entered into an Individual Voluntary Arrangement in Hong Kong.
- 2. Contrary to Regulation 3(1) of the Complaints and Disciplinary Regulations 2014, failed to cooperate fully or at all with the investigation into a complaint in that she failed to provide a response to any of ACCA's correspondence dated:
 - (a) 22 July 2024;
 - (b) 22 August 2024;
 - (c) 28 October 2024
- 3. By reason of her conduct set out at allegation 2, Miss Cheong Yin Mun is:
 - (a) guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i).

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Miss Cheong Yin Mun be excluded from ACCCA membership with immediate effect and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £6000.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.

* An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate effect
