## **Disciplinary Committee ordered student removed\***

On 02 May 2025, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Mr Mohammed Shamaji of Delhi, India:

## <u>Allegations</u>

Mr Mohammed Shamaji, an ACCA student:

- 1. On 06 February 2022, during a remotely invigilated MA – Management Accounting examination ("the Exam"):
  - Whispered or spoke out loud during the Exam and communicated or attempted to a) communicate with a person other than the remote invigilator(s) or proctor(s), contrary to Examination Regulation 16.
  - b) Permitted another person in the room in which he was sitting the Exam, contrary to Examination Regulation 20.
- 2. By reason of his conduct, Mr Shamaji is:
  - Guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i), in respect of all of the matters set out at a) Allegation 1 above.

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Mr Mohammed Shamaji be removed from the student register with immediate effect and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £5,000.00.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.

\* An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate effect
