A hearing of ACCA's Disciplinary Committee will take place at 08:00am on 27 November 2025. It will be held remotely but based at the ACCA's Offices, The Adelphi, 1-11 John Adam Street, London, WC2N 6AU.

The case to be heard on this day concerns Mr Mingfeng He.

Allegations

Mingfeng He ('Mr He'), at all material times an ACCA member,

- Falsely represented to ACCA that he had supervised twelve ACCA trainees between 11 August 2021 1. and 17 October 2022 as part of their practical experience in accordance with ACCA's requirements.
- 2. In relation to allegation 1, such conduct was:
 - Dishonest, in that Mr He knew that he had not supervised the twelve ACCA trainees or any of (a) them, as part of their practical experience, in accordance with ACCA's requirements or at all; or in the alternative:
 - (b) Such conduct demonstrates a lack of integrity.

3.	Failed to co-operate with ACCA's Investigating Officer in breach of the Complaints and Disciplinary Regulations 2014 Regulation 3(1), in that he failed to respond fully or at all to any or all of ACCA's correspondence dated:	
	a)	18 January 2024;
	b)	09 February 2024;
	c)	26 February 2024.
4.	By reason of his conduct, Mr He is:	
	a)	Guilty of misconduct pursuant to ACCA bye-law 8(a)(i) in respect of any or all the matters set out above; or in the alternative:
	b)	Liable to disciplinary action pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(iii).
The allegations listed above are current at the date of publication.		
The case will be heard by a panel of the ACCA's Disciplinary Committee.
