## Disciplinary Committee ordered member Severely Reprimanded\*

On 03 October 2025, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Mr Cormac Donal Collins of Athy, Ireland:

## <u>Allegations</u>

Cormac Collins FCCA:

- 1. Has, in the period between 2008 and 2024 and/or 2025, been carrying on public practice as the sole proprietor and principal of Company A, a firm conducting public practice, without an ACCA practising certificate, contrary to Global Practising Regulations 3(1)(a) and/or 3(2)(a) (2008-2024/2025).
- 2. Has not, in the period between 2023 to 2024 and/or 2025, been registered for supervision for compliance with the anti-money laundering provisions under the Criminal Justice (Money Laundering and Terrorist Financing Acts 2010 to 2021), contrary to Global Practising Regulations (Annex 2) 3(3) (2023-2025).
- 3. Is, by virtue of all of the facts in allegations 1 and 2 above:
  - 3.1 Guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i).

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Mr Cormac Donal Collins be severely reprimanded and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £7950.00.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.

* An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period
referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate
