Disciplinary Committee ordered member excluded/*

On 08 October 2025, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Mr Tonderai Luwisi of Lusaka, Zambia:

<u>Allegations</u>

Mr Tonderai Luwisi, an ACCA member:

- 1. On 29 August 2023 Mr Tonderai Luwisi was convicted of the following offence by the High Court of Zambia (criminal division), which is an offence discreditable to the Association and to the accountancy profession:
 - i) On 10 December 2022, at Lusaka, the Republic of Zambia, Mr Luwisi murdered Pelagia Muregwi, contrary to section 200 of the Penal Code Chapter 87 of the Laws of Zambia.
- 2. In relation to Allegation 1, Mr Tonderai Luwisi failed to bring promptly to the attention of ACCA that he may have become liable to disciplinary action by reason of the conviction referred to in Allegation 1(i) above, contrary to byelaw 10(b).
- 3. By reason of the matters referred to in Allegations 1 to 2 above:
 - Mr Luwisi is guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i); and/or in the alternative: (a)
 - Mr Luwisi is liable to disciplinary action pursuant to bye-laws 8(a)(iii) and/or 8(a)(ix). (b)

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Mr Luwisi be excluded from ACCA membership and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £7,125.00.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.

* An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate effect
