Notice of hearing

A hearing of ACCA's Disciplinary Committee will take place at 08.00am on 16 and 17 April 2026. It will be held remotely but based at the ACCA's Offices, The Adelphi, 1-11 John Adam Street, London, WC2N 6AU.

The hearing is open to any member of the public or the media who wish to attend. However, ACCA is only able to accommodate remote access to the hearing. Please contact adminadjudication@accaglobal.com to obtain information about attending this (or any other) hearing.

The case to be heard on this day concerns Miss Nur Adam.

Allegations

Miss Nur Adam, an ACCA member:

1. Between 9 January 2024 and 22 February 2024, while she was employed at the Firm, improperly claimed expenses amounting to about £2,200.64 in breach of Firm A's Travel and Expenses Policy.
2. Ms Adam's conduct in respect of the matters described in Allegation 1 above was:
 - a) Dishonest, in that Ms Adam claimed expenses from Firm A when she knew she was not entitled to them; or, in the alternative:
 - b) Such conduct demonstrates a failure to act with integrity.
3. In relation to allegation 1 above, Ms Adam was summarily dismissed from Firm A for gross misconduct on 18 July 2024, being a fact or matter indicating that she may have become liable to disciplinary action within the meaning of bye-law 10(b).

4. In relation to allegation 3 above, Ms Adam failed to bring promptly to the attention of ACCA this fact or matter contrary to bye-law 10(b), ACCA only having been notified of it by Ms Adam on 18 October 2024.
5. By reason of any or all of the above, Ms Adam is:
 - a) Guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i); or in the alternative:
 - b) Liable to disciplinary action pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(iii).
