Notice of hearing

A hearing of ACCA's Disciplinary Committee will take place at 08:30am on 07 January 2026. It will be held remotely but based at the ACCA's Offices, The Adelphi, 1-11 John Adam Street, London, WC2N 6AU.

The hearing is open to any member of the public or the media who wish to attend. However, ACCA is only able to accommodate remote access to the hearing. Please contact adminadjudication@accaglobal.com to obtain information about attending this (or any other) hearing.

The case to be heard on this day concerns Miss Bia Asif.

Allegations

Miss Bia Asif, a student member of the ACCA, in relation to an on-demand remotely invigilated CBE, MA2 Managing Costs and Finance examination ("the Exam"), on 06 October 2023:

- 1. Caused or permitted a third party to be present in the exam room with her during the Exam.
- 2. In the alternative to paragraph 1, failed to prevent a third party from entering the exam room and/or remaining in the exam room during the Exam.
- 3. Further to allegations 1 or 2, caused or permitted the third party to capture and/or copy live exam content with a mobile phone with camera, an unauthorised item within the meaning of Exam Regulations.
- Failed to have her full face visible to the camera in the centre of the screen throughout the Exam, 4. contrary to ACCA's exams Student Terms and Conditions for Remote On Demand CBEs and/or the exam guidelines issued by ACCA.
- 5. Further to allegations 1 to 4 above, Miss Asif failed to comply with one or more of:

- (a) Exam Regulation 1, in relation to allegation 4;
- (b) Exam Regulation 10, in relation to allegation 4;
- (c) Exam Regulation 12, in relation to allegation 3; and:
- (d) Exam Regulation 20, in relation to allegation 1 or 2.
- 6. Further to allegations 1 to 5 above, any or all of Miss Asif's conduct was:
 - (a) Dishonest, in that she caused or permitted the third party to use a mobile phone with camera during the exam to capture and/or copy live exam content in order to gain an unfair advantage for herself and/or for others in the Exam or in any re-sit of the exam; or in the alternative:
 - (b) Such conduct demonstrates a lack of integrity.
- 7. Contrary to Regulation 3(1) of the Complaints and Disciplinary Regulations 2014, Miss Asif failed to co-operate fully with the investigation of a complaint in that she failed to respond fully or at all to ACCA's correspondence dated:
 - (a) 16 October 2023;
 - (b) 12 February 2024;
 - (c) 06 June 2025;
 - (d) 16 June 2025.
- 8. By reason of any or all of the above Miss Asif is:
 - (a) Guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye law 8(a)(i); or in the alternative:
 - (b) Liable to disciplinary action by virtue of bye law 8(a)(iii).

The allegations listed above are current at the date of publication.

The case will be heard by a panel of the ACCA's Disciplinary Committee.
