The case to be heard on this day concerns Mr David Charles Lafferty.

Allegations

Mr David Charles Lafferty being a Fellow of ACCA and at all material times holder of an ACCA practising certificate:

1. Between 05 December 2025 and March 2026, on the dates particularised in Schedule 1 below:
 - (a) Failed to supply the ACCA with all the information necessary to enable the ACCA to complete its monitoring process efficiently, for the purposes of Regulation 14(1) of the Global Practising Regulations 2003 ("GPR") (as amended), contrary to Regulation 14(2) of the GPR; and/or:
 - (b) Failed to co-operate with the ACCA in its monitoring and enforcement of compliance with the GPR and/or with ACCA's bye-laws, contrary to GPR Regulation 14(3).
