Disciplinary Committee ordered exclusion from membership*

On 02 September 2026, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Mr Gavin John Wallace, of Stoneleigh, England.

Allegations

Mr Gavin John Wallace ("Mr Wallace"), a member of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants:

1. Between 05 April 2016 and 01 February 2019, Mr Wallace in his self assessment tax returns for 2015 to 2016, 2016 to 2017 and/or 2017 to 2018 declared, or caused to be declared, in respect of Company A, the dividend income set out in Schedule 1, when his dividend income from Company A was more than that was declared.

Schedule 1

Self Assessment Tax Return	Dividend Declared
2015 - 2016	£9,500
2016 - 2017	£18,909
2017 - 2018	£10,853

2. Mr Wallace's conduct set out in Allegation 1 above was:
 - a) Dishonest in that he knew that the declarations were inaccurate;
3. By reason of any, or all, of his conduct set out above, Mr Wallace is:

- a) Guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i).

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Mr Wallace be excluded from membership and to pay costs of £8,087.50 to ACCA.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.

** An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate effect"*
