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ACCA is a membership body for professional accountants and the route to membership and the protected title of 'Chartered Certified Accountant' is through the ACCA Qualification. ACCA supports more than **227,000** members, and 544,000 students and affiliates, with a network of 110 offices and centres worldwide. ACCA works to achieve and promote the highest professional, ethical and governance standards and advance the public interest. ACCA is a founding member of the International Federation of Accountants (IFAC) and meets all the requirements of the IFAC International Education Standards.

The ACCA Qualification is structured to provide development and progression from entry level to completion of the Strategic Professional examinations at Master's degree level.

ACCA STATUTORY RECOGNITION

ACCA's responsibilities to the UK Privy Council, under the Royal Charter granted by Her Majesty the Queen, and under statute, require it to act in the public interest. ACCA is recognised and regulated by the 'Financial Reporting Council' (FRC) in the UK, due to ACCA's statutory responsibilities, to qualify and supervise 'statutory auditors' in the UK. ACCA's official listing as a 'Recognised Supervisory Body' and 'Recognised Qualifying Body' for UK statutory auditors can be found on the FRC website. Similiarly, ACCA is a 'Recognised Accountancy Body' and 'Prescribed Accountancy Body' in Ireland and regulated by the Irish Auditing and Accounting Supervisory Authority (IAASA). Through the European Union (EU) Statutory Audit directive, ACCA members who are EEA audit license holders can access similar regulated roles across the EU.

ACCA QUALIFICATION STANDARD

ACCA's External Examiner reports quarterly on the standard of the ACCA Strategic Professional examinations and ACCA Applied Skills examinations against the UK Framework for Higher Educational Qualifications (FHEQ) level descriptors, to assure the examinations are set at the appropriate levels outlined in the table below.

UK ENIC equates the ACCA Qualification to a UK 'Taught Master's' degree.

UK FRAMEWORK RECOGNITION

The ACCA Qualification is regulated and credit rated by a UK government education regulator, the 'Scottish Qualifications Authority Accreditation' (SQA Accreditation) since 2012. SQA Accreditation's functions are set out in the Education (Scotland) Act 1996 as amended by the Scottish Qualifications Act 2002. SQA Accreditation accredits qualifications other than degrees and approves and quality assures awarding bodies that plan to enter people for these qualifications.

SQA Accreditation has approved ACCA as an Awarding Body' and has accredited the ACCA Qualification following an extensive credit rating and external validation exercise. As a result, all levels of the ACCA Qualification have been credit rated on the Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF), which is one of the national qualification frameworks in the UK. The UK has a number of national qualification frameworks and the alignment of the UK and Irish frameworks is provided by the UK Quality Assurance Agency (QAA) here.

The credit rating information of the ACCA Qualification can be viewed on the SCQF database by entering 'ACCA' in the 'Owner of Qualification' field. ACCA's Strategic Professional examinations are credit rated at 180 credits at Level 11 (the same credits as a Master's degree), the Applied Skills examinations are credit rated at 242 credits at Level 10 and the Applied Knowledge examinations are credit rated at 91 credits at Level 8. The Strategic Professional exams also correspond to the EQF at Level 7, Master's degree level, and are credit rated in the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS), with 90 ECTS credits for the Strategic Professional exams, 121 ECTS credits for the Applied Skills exams, and 45.5 ECTS credits for the Applied Knowledge exams.


UNIVERSITY OF LONDON
