WHAT IS ACCA'S BIG ETHICS AND SUSTAINABILITY CONVERSATION?

As our world strives to recover from the impact of Covid-19, we're seeing society's values shift faster than ever as citizens across the globe seek a fairer, greener and more ethical world. There is growing demand for organisations and nations to become more sustainable, and more resilient, by committing to minimising their environmental impact whilst putting social responsibility at the heart of strategy.

Professional accountants have a vital role in building this sustainable world because sustainable businesses deliver financial returns while generating positive value for society and being environmentally responsible for the planet.

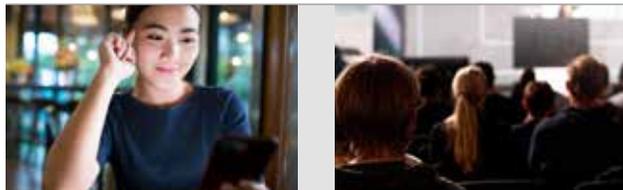
Recognising our vital role, we're marking Global Ethics Day 2020* by kicking off a Big Conversation on the role of the accountancy profession in creating a more ethical and sustainable world. Through our Big Conversation, we hope to inspire individual action by openly and constructively discussing the pressing ethical and sustainable challenges of today, and exchanging views and solutions on what we, as professional accountants, can do to help organisations around the world.

ABOUT THIS GUIDE

This guide is designed to help you run a one-hour conversation with up to twelve people. If you have more than twelve people taking part then it may be better to split into smaller groups so everyone has the opportunity to contribute to the conversation.

The questions and script will guide you and participants through the conversation. We've included some facilitator discussion tips for each question to help participants think about today's ethical and sustainability challenges and to stimulate deeper conversations about the role of the accountancy profession and professional accountants in creating a more ethical and sustainable world.

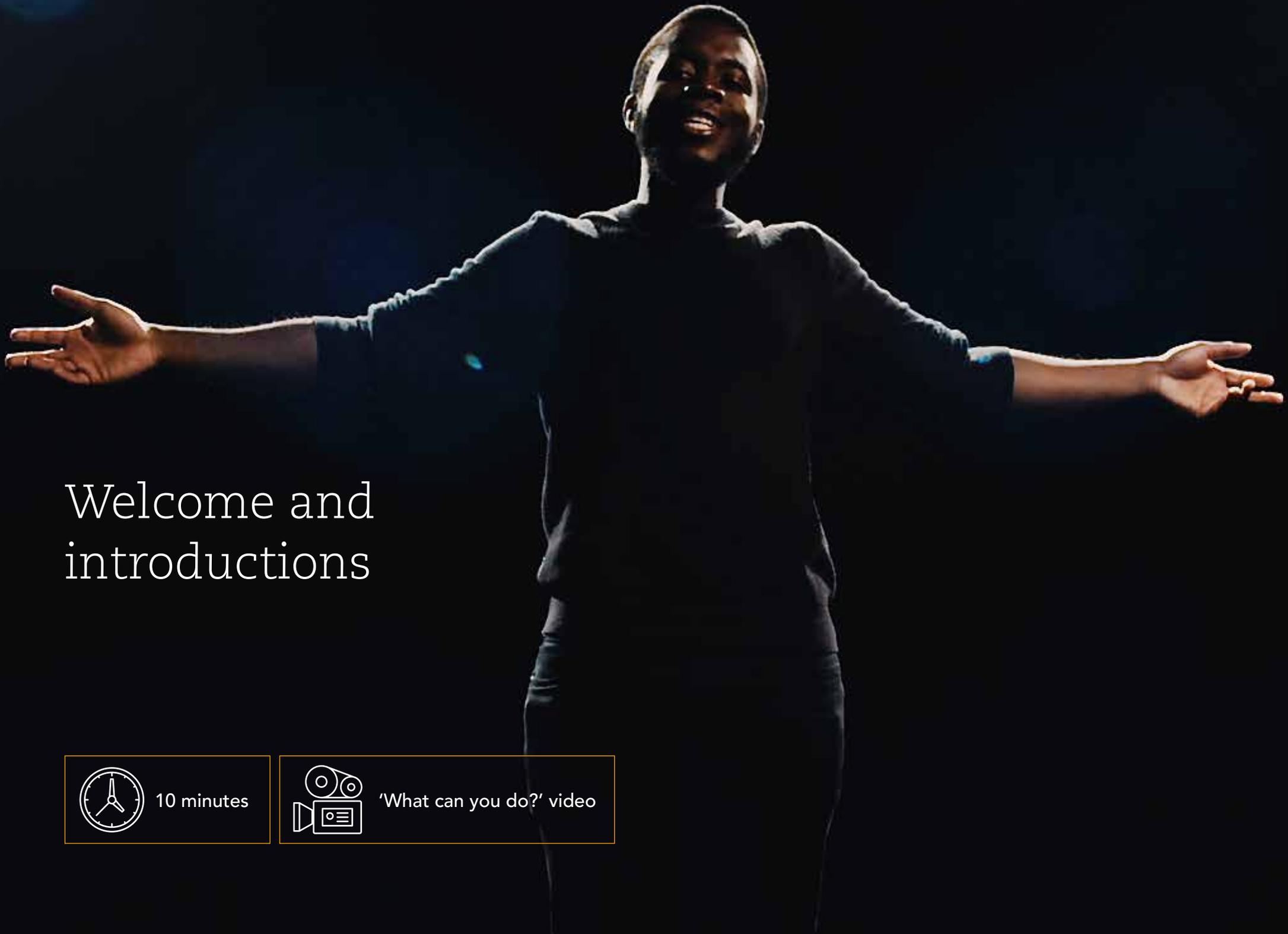

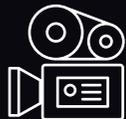

Welcome and introductions



10 minutes



'What can you do?' video

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Ask all participants to introduce themselves.

You could also ask people to tell the group why they decided to take part in the Big Conversation.

2. Set out the background to the Big Conversation by reading out the following:

'Recognising our vital role, ACCA is marking Global Ethics Day 2020 – a project of Carnegie Council for ethics in international affairs – by kicking off a Big Conversation on the role of the accountancy profession in creating a more ethical and sustainable world. Through our Big Conversation, we hope to inspire individual action by openly and constructively discussing the pressing ethical and sustainable challenges of today, and exchanging views and solutions on what we, as professional accountants, can do to help organisations around the world.'

What are the most pressing ethical and sustainability challenges of today?

DISCUSSION ONE

Ask the group for their views on what they think the most pressing ethical and sustainability issues are – each person can suggest as many as they like.

Create a list of issues raised that can be seen by all participants – you can use the blank slide in the PowerPoint pack or a whiteboard facility.

SUGGESTED FACILITATOR DISCUSSION POINTS:

- Why did you pick this issue?
- Why does this concern you so much?
- If we had to prioritise, which would you say are the most serious
 - > Have some become more pressing because of Covid-19?
 - > What's are the main barriers to addressing this issue?
 - > Why isn't <non-prioritised issue> so important?
- What are the consequences of doing nothing?
- What are the benefits of change?

ISSUES YOUR GROUP MAY RAISE:

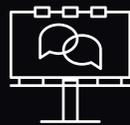
- Global warming and extreme weather
- Economic inequality
- Secure employment and income
- Biodiversity loss and species extinction
- Waste culture and plastic pollution
- Air quality and access to clean water
- Equality of access to healthcare and education
- Barriers to inclusion and diversity
- Rapid urban growth
- Market concentration and lack of opportunity for new entrants

DISCUSSION **two** THE SOLUTIONS

DISCUSSION TWO

Read out the following statement:

The global response to these issues requires collective action – from government and policy makers, the private sector and individuals. In recent months, there has been a call from the UN and many others for the world to use Covid-19 as a turning point, to work towards a sustainable recovery that balances people, planet and profit.

Ask the group 'From what your experience, of your own organisations and/or those that you deal with, do you think there is a commitment to a sustainable recovery?'

SUGGESTED FACILITATOR DISCUSSION POINTS:

- Are there examples of organisations/business that are using this an opportunity to become more sustainable?
- What are the main barriers to becoming a sustainable business?
- How can these barriers be overcome?

DISCUSSION **three** OUR ROLE

What's our role – what can we do, as professional accountants, to create more ethical and sustainable businesses?

DISCUSSION **THREE**

Read out the following statement:

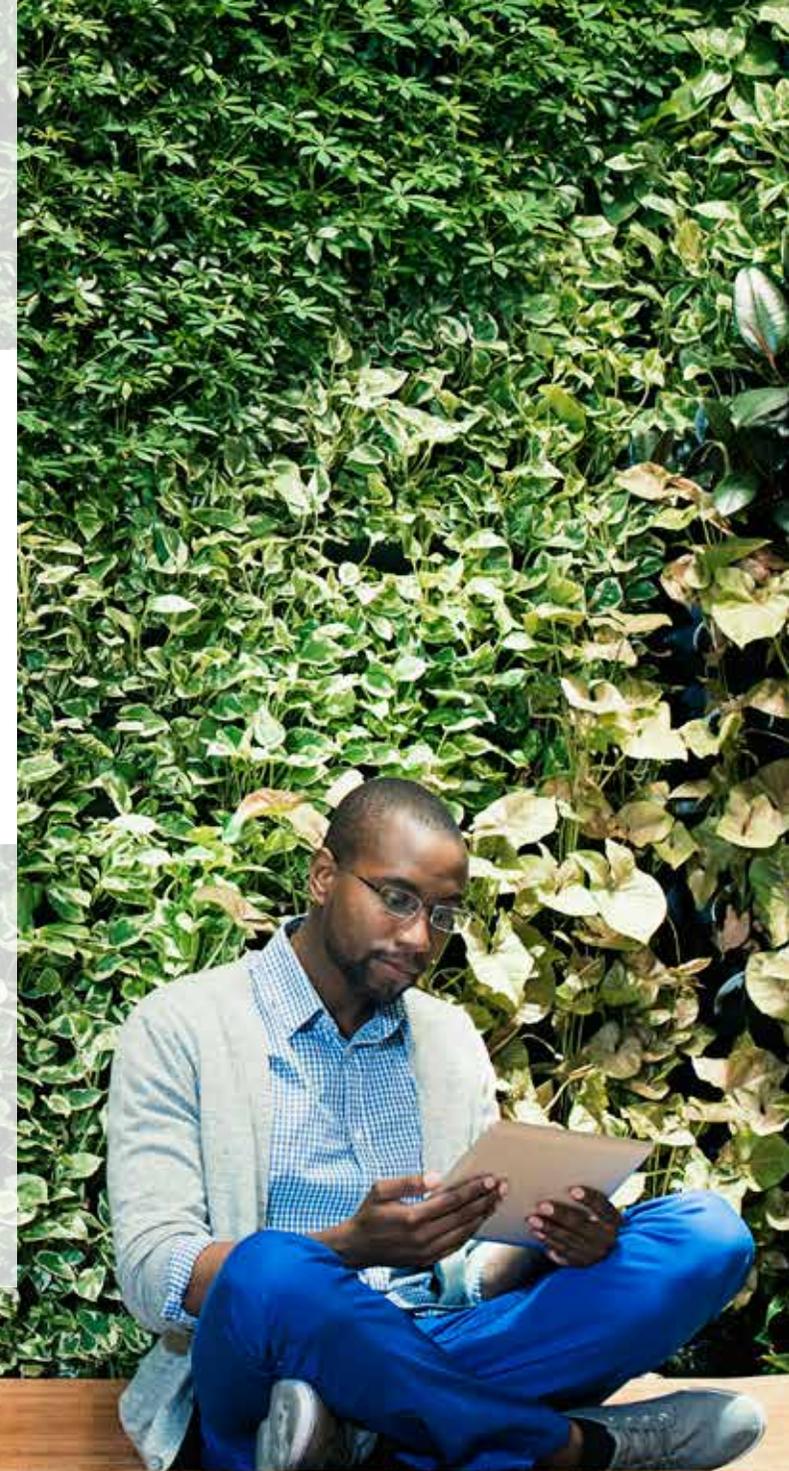
Professional accountants across the world are playing a vital role in leading, supporting and advising organisations in all sectors through the challenges of Covid-19 and towards recovery. Our expertise is needed more than ever. And, our role – at the heart of business – provides us with the opportunity to influence whether, or not, our organisations embark on a journey towards a sustainable recovery.

Ask the group for their views on 'What is our role, what can we do to create a more ethical and sustainable businesses?'

SUGGESTED FACILITATOR DISCUSSION POINTS:

- Do you see us as the driving force, the leaders? Or do we support?
- What are the challenges / barriers we face?
- What skills can we offer / what new skills do we need?
- What support do we need? And from who?

DISCUSSION THREE (CONTINUED)

THE ROLE OF ACCOUNTANTS THAT YOUR GROUP MAY RAISE:

- Build knowledge and literacy across the spectrum of business related non-financial, sustainable development and impact-related issues – for example take the **climate risk e-learning course**
- Learn about the different sustainability decision-making and reporting methodologies and frameworks that can help you address these issues, for example, the IR framework or the Climate Risk reporting Framework, the **TCFD**.
- Think about the types of information you would need to address social and environmental issues and what processes you would need to put in place so that you can use it in a meaningful way.
- Ask your senior management team about their governance and knowledge of sustainability related issues.
- Make a case for the finance team to run a pilot study examine a specific issue that impacts your organisation by for example using the **SDG Disclosure Recommendations**
- Reach out to other parts of your organisation to find out how you can support them on social and environmental impact issues.
- Make connections with external groups eg NGOs and local networks, working on social and environmental issues.
