# Introductions, welcome to new panel members.

Panel members confirmed that they had read and understood the panel principles which govern the purpose of the group and the conduct of members.

#### Overview of the sector

A presentation outlining the numbers and make-up of the sector, and the key issues facing it, was shared with the panel.

- as of January 2023 there are 8,700 members and 332 affiliates in the UK public sector
- 32% of members in the sector work in the not-for-profit sector, 28% in higher education, 20% in local government and 20% in central government
- 35% of affiliates in the sector work in the not-for-profit sector, 31% in higher education, 20% in local government and 14% in national government

The most common issues were talent recruitment and retention and funding, these themes were common across all the sub-sectors within the public sector.

# **Guest presenter**

Lloyd Powell, head of ACCA Wales, presented an overview of the work of the Strategic Engagement team and how panel members can get involved.



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#### Discussion and insight from panel members

The panel discussed the following points:

- understanding the needs of members in the sector what issues have you heard about "on the ground"?
- what does community look like to you?
- how can we strengthen our public sector community in the UK?
- working with relevant partners to promote the importance of the sector, build our brand and visibility of members

The group discussed face-to-face events and how competitors were running these again. Astrid explained that ACCA were using the "LinkUp" format to bring members together across the regions and that a Sector and Communities Manager would be allocated to different regions to assist in running an event. Partnerships are also being used to facilitate face-to-face networking opportunities.

The public sector conference this year will be a global virtual one, planned to be held in November
